History of YMCA of Kuala Lumpur

YMCA BEGAN WITH CHANGE

The Young Men's Christian Association is an international voluntary Christian ecumenical movement that endeavours to echo the cultural identity of the Nation in which it exists and serves.

Founded in 1844 in London, pioneered by a group of young men led by George Williams who were concerned with serving fellow young men who like themselves, came to the city during Europe's Industrial Revolution. At the time, the youth faced many social and civic issues whereby they were exploited, overworked and brutally treated. Driven by compassion, they formed the YMCA with the aim of the "improvement of the spiritual condition of the young men engaged in houses of business."

Together with the other founding members George Williams wasted no time in organising YMCA branches throughout England, Scotland and Ireland. Since then, the YMCA concept has spread to every continent. Today, there is a worldwide organisation based in Geneva, Switzerland with more than 57 million beneficiaries from 125 national associations.

The vision of creating a truly global movement with an international headquarters was pioneered by Henry Dunant, then Secretary of YMCA Geneva who would later go on to establish the International Committee of the Red Cross and win the first Nobel Peace Prize.

Henry Dunant successfully convinced YMCA leaders to organise the first YMCA World Conference, where the Paris Basis was adopted, affirming the YMCA's mission and purpose and created the Central International Committee what is now known as the World Alliance of YMCAs.

THE PARIS BASIS

The Young Men's Christian Associations seek to unite those young men who, regarding Jesus Christ as their God and Saviour, according to the Holy Scriptures, desire to be His disciples in their faith and in their life and to associate their efforts for the extension of His Kingdom amongst young men.

The YMCA of Kuala Lumpur: A Century of Service and Spirit

When It All Began

It all started on 10 August 1905, when 30 founding members had a shared vision to form a YMCA in Kuala Lumpur. Their vision came to life with the inauguration of the YMCA at a shop lot at No. 3 Wulkin Street, next to the Kuala Lumpur Railway Station on 27 October 1905 with 141 members.

From these humble beginnings, the YMCA of Kuala Lumpur began its journey guided by Christian values, committed to youth development and dedicated to building a stronger community.

In 1908, the government granted the YMCA a piece of land in Brickfields, where a simple plank and atap building was constructed. By 1915, with a key contribution from Towkay Loke Yew and with additional generous contributions from the Honourable Mr. Eu Tong Sen and Towkay Lee Kong Lam a new building with modern facilities such as a gym, billiard room, Secretary's office, a refreshment room, 3 spacious verandahs, toilets and servant quarters was built, marking a bold new chapter for the Association.

Throughout the decades, the YMCA adapted to challenges and changes. Even during the Japanese Occupation in 1941, the YMCA remained active being allowed to run the hostel and sports activities during the early part of the occupation largely due to the efforts of a Japanese Christian, Mr. Ogawa. After the war, the building was returned by the British Army in 1946 and the YMCA was officially re-opened on 27 September 1946 by H.E. Sir Edward Gent, Governor of the Malayan. Activities were re-established on a reduced scale.

The post-war years were marked by growth and innovation. In 1951, the first YMCA KL Youth Club was launched. By the 1960s, a bold decision was made to demolish all existing structures and construct a new building along the then Kandang Kerbau Road (now known as Jalan Padang Belia). The foundation stone was laid by HRH Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah in 1966 and the new building was officially opened in 1968, thanks in large part to the dedication of the late Mr. T. Moro Sr. who made personal and financial sacrifices to ensure that the building was completed.

The following decades saw a flurry of community-based programmes. The Deaf Club was formed in 1973, the first of its kind in Malaysia followed by the establishment of the Pusat Majudiri Y and the first Senior Citizens Club in 1984. The Association also supported the Deaf in launching Silent World Sdn Bhd, the first Deaf owned and operated laundrette.

The late Tan Yap was a dedicated volunteer who devoted much of his time in the 1990 to supporting the deaf club and community. For his tireless contributions he is fondly remembered as the 'father of the deaf'.

The YMCA didn't just build programmes it built people. Leaders like Rev. Tan Chi Kiong and Mr. Yip Kok Choong went on to serve in regional YMCA leadership roles, furthering Malaysia's presence on the Asia-Pacific stage. In 1995, YMCA KL hosted the 14th General Assembly of the Asia Alliance of YMCAs in Port Dickson and celebrated its anniversary with a dinner in Kuala Lumpur.







YMCA Toy Library

In 1996, the Association took another pioneering step by establishing Malaysia's first Toy Library for children with special needs. This initiative was later adopted by SP Setia on 19 January 2001, expanding its impact even further.

Into the 2000s, the YMCA continued to evolve. The YMCA Alumni was formed, a Professional Learning Centre was introduced and the Community Childcare Centre was launched. That same year, the Deaf Communication and Information Technology Training Centre was established with a sponsorship from the Embassy of Japan and the Sign Language Resource Centre was made possible through sponsorship by HSBC Bank.

From its earliest days to today, YMCA KL has remained committed to uniting young people in faith, service and community. What began as a small gathering of 30 has become a legacy of empowerment, compassion and hope — continuing to make a difference, one life at a time.

From 2005 onwards, YMCA Kuala Lumpur continued to grow in both impact and inclusivity. Its 100th anniversary in 2005 was marked with Centenary Charity Golf event, with proceeds supporting the development of the Deaf Community Centre (Pusat Majudiri 'Y') followed by a Thanksgiving Service and Anniversary Dinner. In 2007, PMY launched DeafBeat—Malaysia's first deaf Chinese drum troupe, empowering deaf youth through rhythm and performance. By 2011, YMCA KL was hosting vibrant community programmes such as the Community Children's Christmas Celebration, Wishing Tree Project, Youth Sports Carnival and Holiday Basketball Camp offering meaningful engagement for families and youth, especially from the deaf community. In 2014, the R.O.A.R. (Reach Out and Restore) programme was introduced as a consolidated platform for sustainable community initiatives led by volunteers and youth.

The Association celebrated its 110th anniversary in 2015 by unveiling a new vision: "Empower, Transform, Build," which was marked with a fundraising dinner to support future development. During the pandemic, YMCA KL swiftly adapted by offering online classes, launching the YMCA Virtual Run and providing food aid and emotional support-demonstrating its continued resilience and compassion in times of crisis. In 2024, YMCA Kuala Lumpur partnered with the Humanitarian Experience Program (HXP) from the United States, through its Malaysia: Love initiative, to foster deeper inclusion by engaging volunteers with the deaf, blind and special-needs communities reflecting the organisation's ongoing commitment to empathy, service and love. To commemorate YMCA KL's 120th Anniversary, a weekend-long Carnival will be held in celebration of this historic milestone, followed by a heartfelt Thanksgiving Service and a grand Anniversary Dinner.

The most important part of his association with the Kuala Lumpur YMCA was to put up the building which we presently are using. With the help of the late Rev. Lloyd De Run, they spent many hours in approaching people to help them with the necessary funds to put up the building. Those were difficult days, but thanks to GOD, the building was finally completed in 1967 and officiated in 1968 by the late Sultan of Selangor HRH Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah.





Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCA (APAY)

he Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCAs (APAY), an integral part of the World YMCA, is a federation of twenty-four (24) national and territorial YMCA movements across the Asia-Pacific region, with offices based in Jeju, Korea and Hong Kong.

As a faith-based social movement, the YMCA is an international, voluntary and ecumenical organisation grounded in Christian teachings: love, justice and peace.

As an Area Alliance comprising and representing 24 national movements in the region, APAY promotes Inter-Movement Cooperation (IMC) among national movements, with other regions and with the World Alliance. It identifies and acts upon common thrusts rooted in the spirit of mutual trust and mutual accountability and serves as a platform for dialogue, consultation, capacity-building and collective advocacy.





APAY and its member associations are currently engaged in movement thrusts aligned with Vision 2030 and QPP 2024–2027, which focus on four key pillars: community well-being, meaningful work, a sustainable planet and a just world. All APAY programs primarily emphasize youth empowerment (global citizenship), peacebuilding with justice (including the Interfaith Cooperation Forum), sustainable community development, gender justice and equity, climate crisis response and alternative tourism—most of which are closely linked to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs).

MCA Kuala Lumpur began humbly in 1905 and will be celebrating its 120th anniversary on 11 October 2025 with great festivity. From its modest beginnings as a lone building, the YMCA KL has come a long way and will include a new facility building that will be used for a wider range of activities such as a Multipurpose Hall, Classrooms, Training rooms and much more.

Membership is the heartbeat of YMCA KL. Within it are various committees made up of YMCA members themselves and related staff. It is from this Membership that the Board of Directors is formed, elected through a voting process among the Full members. The existing committees include Christian Identity and Mission (CIM), Finance and Accounts (FAC), Senior Citizens Club (SCC), Education and Training, Pusat Majudiri Y (PMY), Hostel and Facilities and the Programme, Sports & Youth.

Over the years, a diverse array of activities were organised to benefit our members and foster

community engagement. Longstanding clubs such as the 3rd KL Boys' Brigade, Senior Citizens Club and Table Tennis Club continued to thrive with popular, well-attended programmes.

The Programme Department also arranged several enjoyable foodie trips to destinations like Cameron Highlands, Bentong, Teluk Intan and Penang, offering members unique experiences and opportunities for fellowship.

As of now, YMCA KL proudly holds a strong membership base of approximately 2,200 members. Among the most notable new sign-ups are those participating in Language classes, children football coaching, Senior citizens dance sessions and guitar lessons.

We look forward to continued growth and hope our members will renew their membership and remain active in the YMCA KL community, both now and in the years to come.







Hostel & Facilities cum Building Maintenance

ver the past year, YMCA Kuala Lumpur has undertaken a range of maintenance and improvement projects for its hostel and facilities. By February 2025, all minor repairs and upgrades in the hostel rooms were successfully completed. These included replacing carpets with SPC flooring, repainting walls and upgrading various room equipment. Moving forward, the next phase of improvements will focus on enhancing shared facilities and replacing outdated equipment.

Facility bookings—including halls and classrooms—have shown steady growth. Events such as weddings, birthday celebrations, conferences and festive gatherings have significantly increased compared to the previous year. As part of YMCA KL's open-area beautification efforts, a cleaning and clearing project was carried out at the end of 2024 near the car park area adjacent to the bus stop fencing.

The field at YMCA KL remains a valuable asset for a variety of activities. Since late 2022, it has been rented out during the day to the AirAsia Drone Academy (AADA) for drone training. In addition to football, the field has served as a venue for community events, sports training and outdoor recreational programs—making it a dynamic hub for various groups and organisations. This collaboration with AADA will continue into 2025, further maximizing the use of the field.













On 7 May 2024, YMCA KL once again partnered with the Selangor and Federal Territory Association for the Mentally Handicapped (SAMH) to conduct Basic Housekeeping Training for three trainees from the Vocational Training Centre, Wisma Harapan, Brickfields. This marked the fourth batch of such training. YMCA KL remains committed to this initiative in line with its vision and mission, providing ongoing support for individuals with special needs. Looking ahead, once the new building project is completed, YMCA KL hopes to create employment opportunities for these individuals.


This year has been one of significant progress for YMCA KL's hostel and facilities. The successful completion of key projects—such as room upgrades and open-area beautification—reflects the organisation's commitment to continuous improvement. The increasing demand for facility bookings reinforces YMCA KL's role as a preferred venue for a variety of events. Ongoing partnerships with organisations like AADA and SAMH further demonstrate YMCA KL's dedication to community engagement.

Looking ahead, the hostel and facilities will continue to undergo upgrades across multiple areas. YMCA KL also plans to introduce sustainability initiatives, including power-saving measures, timely replacement of room amenities and the implementation of a greenery project in the car park and around the building's surroundings. These efforts align with YMCA KL's broader mission to provide a welcoming, inclusive and environmentally responsible space for all.

The department serves as a guiding light in promoting moral values, spiritual growth and social responsibility among members, staff and the wider community. It organises regular Christian fellowships, Bible studies, seasonal celebrations, prayer gatherings and worship services, while also forging inter-church collaborations that reflect the unity of the Body of Christ.













Beyond the spiritual programmes, CIM is actively involved in community outreach efforts—extending care and compassion to the underserved, regardless of race or religion. It champions a holistic approach to ministry by fostering a culture of inclusiveness, humility and servant leadership.

Sports & Martial Arts

he YMCA has made history in sports as the birthplace of both basketball and futsal. Basketball was invented in 1891 by Dr. James Naismith at the YMCA Training School in Springfield, USA, as an indoor game to keep students active during winter. Today, it has grown into one of the most popular sports worldwide. In 1930, futsal was created by Juan Carlos Ceriani at the YMCA in Montevideo, Uruguay, as a five-a-side indoor version of football. Designed for smaller courts, it emphasises skill, teamwork and speed and has since spread globally as a sport officially recognised by FIFA. Both games reflect the YMCA's mission of building a healthy spirit, mind and body while uniting communities through the power of sport.

At YMCA KL, sports programmes for children have long been a priority, with football and basketball making a significant impact over the years. These activities not only keep children active and healthy, but also nurture values of sportsmanship, discipline and leadership. Through such programmes, YMCA KL helps shape young participants into future leaders, equipping them with confidence, teamwork and a positive mindset to face the future.











Martial arts have been an integral part of YMCA KL for more than 60 years, with long-standing disciplines such as Judo, Karate and Aikido continuing to thrive till today. Over time, YMCA KL has expanded its offerings to include a wider variety of martial arts — such as Taekwondo, Kickboxing and Silambam — all provided at affordable rates to ensure accessibility for the community.

These programmes cater to participants of all ages, from young children to adults, fostering discipline, confidence and physical fitness.

Climate Change

Taking Action for Our Planet: YMCA KL's Climate Change Initiative

In recent years, the Earth's rising temperature has escalated climate change into what is now recognised as a climate emergency. This growing crisis is deeply concerning—not just for environmentalists, but also for organisations like YMCA, whose mission is rooted in serving the community and nurturing future generations.

Climate change is no longer a distant issue. Its effects are already altering daily life, disrupting livelihoods and straining local economies. Recognising the urgency, World YMCA introduced Vision 2030, a global framework aimed at addressing the world's most pressing issues. The Asia and Pacific Alliance of YMCAs (APAY) embraced this vision and further expanded it by including a crucial fourth pillar: Movement Strengthening.

The four pillars guiding the YMCA movement today are:

- Meaningful Work
- Community Wellbeing
- Sustainable Planet
- Just World

In alignment with this global vision, YMCA Kuala Lumpur began its own journey towards sustainability through the Green Initiative, launched in 2019. What started with indoor plant installations gradually expanded to outdoor greening projects across our premises.







Implementing sustainable practices has not been without its challenges. Adopting new habits—such as reducing single use plastics and paper during meetings and events—required adjustment and persistent effort. However, we remain committed to this transformation, taking a step-by-step approach supported by continuous education for both our team and the wider community.

Today, we are proud to say that YMCA KL continues to be a local advocate for environmental responsibility, incorporating green practices into our programmes and nurturing a generation that is both socially conscious and eco-awareness.

- Mini GATN Adventures Short overnight trips for local participants to experience the spirit of GATN while exploring different states in Malaysia.





From the historic towns of Malacca to the scenic beauty of Perak, participants have gained insight into Malaysia's diversity while engaging in meaningful work with communities. Through collaboration with local partners—including villages, NGOs and youth groups—GATN experiences at YMCA KL create a space for mutual learning, intercultural exchange and personal growth.





With God's blessings, YMCA KL was given the opportunity to begin a partnership with Humanitarian Experience Programme (HXP) in 2024, hosting multiple youth groups from the United States. Deaf Works of YMCA Kuala Lumpur

Pusat Majudiri 'Y' (PMY) and the Majudiri 'Y' Foundation for the Deaf (MYF) are dedicated to empowering Deaf individuals through education, training and community engagement.

PMY focuses on direct support, education and skill development for Deaf individuals Programmes like BIM sign language classes, DeafBeat drumming group foster independence and confidence.

MYF plays a broader role in funding and advocacy, ensuring the long-term sustainability of initiatives that benefit the Deaf community. It supports education, provides financial aid and promotes inclusivity through cultural and artistic projects.

Together, they create opportunities for Deaf individuals to thrive, bridging communication gaps and fostering self-reliance and social integration.





Pusat Majudiri 'Y' for the Deaf (PMY)

Pusat Majudiri 'Y' for the Deaf (PMY) was established in 1983 with the goal of providing fair opportunities for the Deaf community to develop and achieve their fullest potential. Based in Kuala Lumpur, PMY focuses on strengthening education, social rights and living standards for Deaf individuals in the Klang Valley.

Key initiatives of PMY:

- 1) Deaf Empowerment Programmes: PMY provides training and workshops to help Deaf individuals gain independence and confidence.
- Bahasa Isyarat Malaysia (BIM) Courses: Offering structured sign language courses to bridge communication gaps between the Deaf and hearing communities.
- 3) **Community Advocacy:** PMY actively promotes accessibility and inclusion for the Deaf in various sectors.
- Deaf Club Activities: Organizing social events, sports meet and excursions to foster a strong sense of community.
- 5) **Educational Support:** Providing tutoring for Deaf children and pre-school programs to introduce sign language at an early age.
- 6) Employment Opportunities: Initiatives like DeafWork and DeafBeat help Deaf individuals secure jobs and showcase their talents.







Majudiri 'Y' Foundation For The Deaf (MYF)



The Majudiri 'Y' Foundation For The Deaf was established to receive and administer funds for education, training youth work, scientific research and for charitable purposes of the Deaf Community. The Foundation is here to work towards helping, guiding and developing the Deaf Citizens of Malaysia irrespective of race, religion and creed In supporting the Deaf Community, the MYF will soon be developed as a Self-Reliance Centre for the Deaf.

Inclusion Programmes:

Friend of the Deaf (FOD) Teens Training Programme

This is a youth empowerment initiative designed to cultivate empathy, leadership and inclusive values among teenagers. Through interactive learning and meaningful engagement with the Deaf community, participants gain a deeper understanding of Deaf culture, communication and advocacy.

2) Children Enhancement Programme

This is a nurturing initiative aimed at supporting the holistic development of Deaf, hard-of-hearing and hearing children. Through inclusive learning experiences, creative expression and social engagement, the programme empowers young participants to grow with confidence, resilience and a strong sense of identity.

3) The Deaf Awareness Workshop

An interactive learning experience designed to foster understanding, empathy and effective communication between Deaf and hearing individuals. Through hands-on activities, cultural insights and practical strategies, participants gain the tools to create more inclusive environments in schools, workplaces and communities.









PMY DeafBeat

PMY DeafBeat is an inspiring initiative under the YMCA Kuala Lumpur's Pusat Majudiri 'Y' for the Deaf (PMY). Established in 2007, this unique percussion group is composed entirely of deaf musicians who specialize in performing Chinese drums. Their performances are a testament to the incredible potential of the deaf community, showcasing qualities like perseverance, determination and self-esteem.

DeafBeat has not only performed locally but also internationally, spreading awareness about the capabilities of deaf individuals and promoting inclusivity through the arts. Their ability to synchronize and create music is achieved through vibrations and visual cues, proving that music transcends the boundaries of hearing. They had broken into the world of Performing Arts by staging three concerts. The first was "Pulsing Spirit" in 2008, followed by "Sound of Silent Dreams" in 2009 and DeafBeat 10th Anniversary Concert 2017.

The international stage has taken them to Cambodia, Hong Kong, India and Poland to perform at music festivals for the disabled. These were:

Philip Thomas, President of YMCA KL and Mr. George Ong, Organising Chairman, together with the YMCA KL Board of Directors. The ceremony reached a touching moment when Deaf children led the community in singing and signing the Negaraku, a powerful symbol of national unity and inclusion.













A Vibrant Marketplace and Fun Activities

The carnival space was transformed into a bustling marketplace, with booths spread across the tennis court and upstairs classrooms. Many vendors were Deaf mothers, single mothers and youth, empowering them to proudly showcase their offerings.

The food stalls featured a delightful mix of cuisines, including briyani, nasi lemak, shepherd's pie, local snacks and desserts, alongside refreshing beverages. Other vendors offered homemade crafts, such as scented candles and jewellery.













Across the venue, families and children enjoyed a wide variety of game booths featuring classics like Pin the Donkey Tail, bowling, darts and many more. In a special gesture of inclusion, the Deaf children were given free coupons to enjoy all the games. Meanwhile, the first floor hosted popular service booths such as blind massage, face painting, henna and manicure/pedicure, as well as the sale of beauty products. A fun highlight for younger guests was the coloring contest for children. The blind massage, game booths, and manicure/pedicure services proved to be the most popular attractions throughout the carnival.

















An Evening of Tribute and Performance

The first day concluded with a heartfelt tribute event for our members and volunteers. At 3 pm, members were treated to a High Tea featuring sumptuous food. This event was dedicated to recognising the members and volunteers who have faithfully supported the work of YMCA over the years.

YB Dato' Sri Hajah Nancy Shukri, Minister of Women, Family and Community Development of Malaysia, was represented by Tuan Pathmanathan, the Pengarah of the Jabatan Pembangunan Orang Kurang Upaya.

The celebration began with a flag-raising ceremony, instilling patriotism and love for the country among the children and participants. As the Jalur Gemilang was raised high, the air was filled with pride, unity and love for the nation. As the flag was raised and the Negaraku was sung, the deaf children signed the lyrics with graceful and expressive movements.

The spirit of unity was deeply felt as people of all races, religions and abilities gathered under one roof, celebrating love, understanding and respect. This community event was about building bridges across differences, creating a space where everyone feels seen, heard and valued.

More than 450 participants from all walks of life and all races and religions, came together to share food, joy and fellowship. It was a living reminder that unity is not found in sameness, but in caring for one another. The event reflected Malaysia's greatest values: harmony, compassion and unity in diversity.

















Showcasing Love, Education and Safety

The celebration was more than just games and exhibitions; it was about giving children who live in silence the chance to see, feel and learn and for the public to understand their world. The program included educational games and interactive activities to strengthen teamwork, awareness and respect.

A public safety exhibition added excitement to the day, featuring a police car, fire engine and ambulance. Children learned about emergency services in a way that was fun, accessible and educational, promoting safety awareness.

The Role of Police and Fire Services

The police and fire services were present to show that caring for one another is a duty of love. Their roles remind us to respect our country, because a nation is strong when every child—whether hearing, deaf, or disabled—feels safe, included and loved.

- The police are protectors who keep our families safe, guide us when we are lost and ensure peace.
 They represent trust, safety and care.
- The fire engine and firefighters are symbols of courage. The sound of the fire alarm is a voice of protection, reminding us that help is always near. Firefighters teach us bravery, teamwork and the importance of helping one another without fear.


